#### **Function**

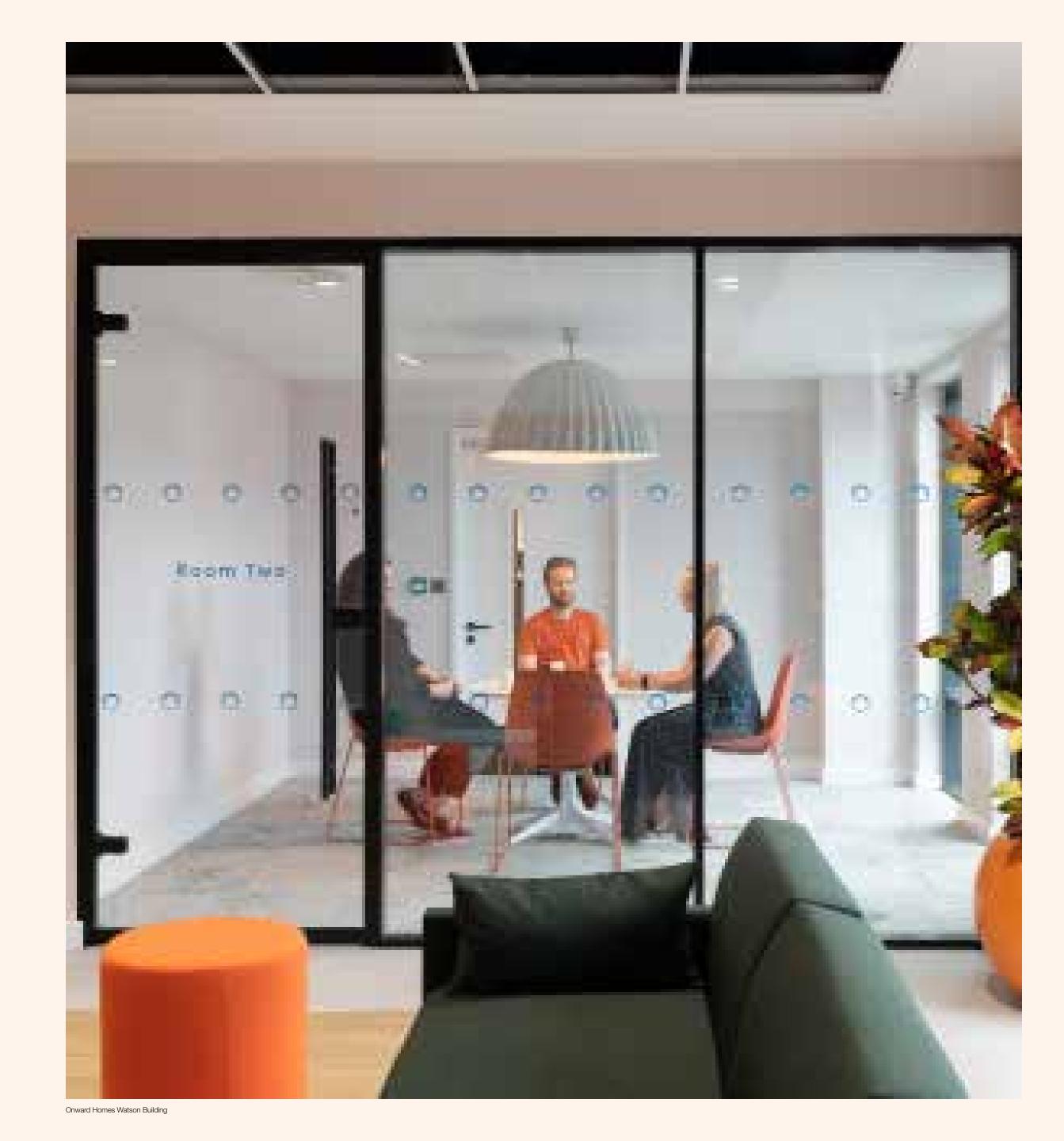
As designers we need to ensure the room is designed suitably to meet its required needs (size, acoustics, heating and cooling, furniture and AV etc).

#### Co-ordination

Ensuring all items are coordinated in the correct way and at the right time of the project.

## Design

As designers we need to ensure the above point are captured without compromising the clients brief, visions, branding and budget.

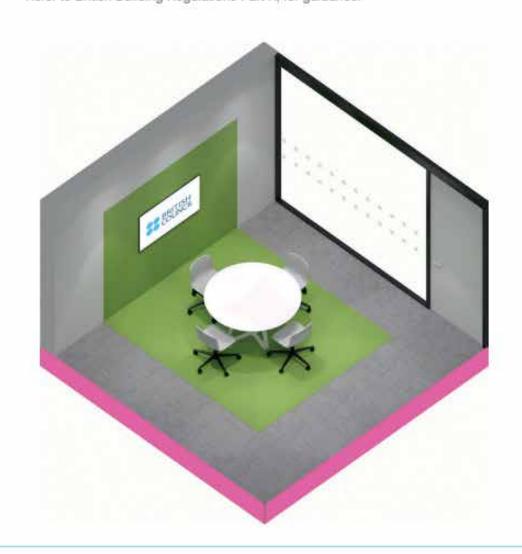
Components:

Wall mounted presentation TV screen (it should not face windows and be visible from outside the room) Blinds for windows (external). Mobile whiteboards/flip-charts.

#### Safety manifestation to glazing:

Two rows of manifestation a min. 50mm wide to all glazing. The first row set between 850mm to 1000mm above finished floor level and the second set between 1400mm and 1600mm above finish floor level.

If alternative colour block film application is used, ensure colour block covers minimums of 1000mm and 1400mm above finished floor level. Refer to British Building Regulations-Part K, for guidance.

#### The Colour Block | Meeting and Phone rooms

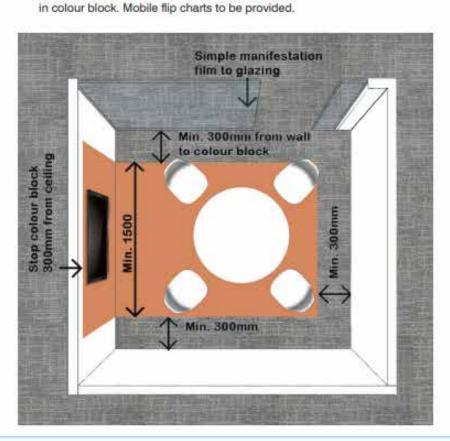
Limit colour blocks to three colours per floor.

Application of colour general notes:

- Internally lit rooms should avoid reds
- . Add colour block to wall even if floor is to remain neutral colour i.e. refurbish-
- Where possible paint side wall furthest away from door.
- Skirting painted to match wall colour.

#### Application of colour block to small meeting rooms

- Colour paint up to 300mm from ceiling and minimum 1500mm wide forming a square or landscape block of colour.
- · Colour block to extend onto the floor in matching carpet tiles set out a minimum of 1500 wide but at 300mm from the wall
- All other wall painted white matt paint from neutral range.
- Artwork or LCD screen to be mounted with-

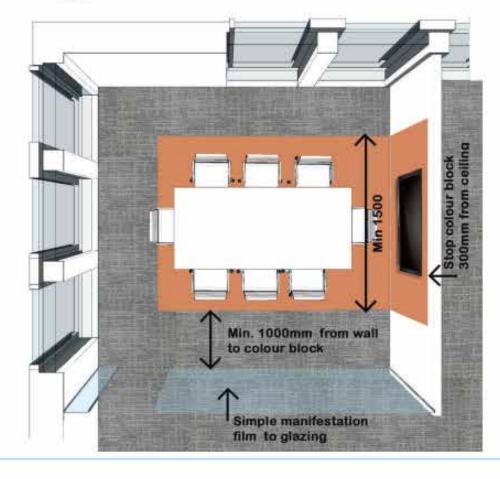


#### Application of colour block to phone rooms

- Colour paint to wall behind desk in phone rooms.
- Colour to extend beyond desk and form horizontal band. Extending as matching translucent film to glazing, if required.

#### Application of colour block to large meeting rooms

- Colour paint up to 300mm from ceiling and minimum 1500mm wide across
- Artwork or LCD screen to be mounted within colour block. Mobile flip
- Colour block to extend onto the floor in matching carpet tiles set out a minimum of 1500 wide but stopping at least 1000mm from walls.
- All other wall painted white matt paint from neutral range.
- Neutral colour to door and frames from neutral range.
- Rooms with no suitable wall longer than 3500mm treat as small meeting

## What defines the 'meeting room' box?

## Revitalising Existing Meeting Rooms

The presented case study aims to revitalize an existing set of meeting rooms that are currently poorly-lit, tired and poor acoustically performing. The client brief proposes minimal intervention to existing partitions and glazing and to retain the existing ceiling lighting and grid. The AV/Media is to be retained and remounted.

Our response updates the existing design with a modern colour palette, additional lighting and improved acoustics. The palette remains predominantly neutral with bursts of colour and interest in the acoustic wall panelling and feature paint banding. New furniture completes the design.

#### Material & Details Key:

- 1. Grid ceiling Wood Wool Infill
- 2. Acoustic Wall Panel
- 3. Neutral Paint Band (Wall)
- 4. Accent Furniture Colour
- 5. Feature Paint Band (Wall)
- 6. Base Furniture Colour
- 7. New Carpet Tile
- 8. Feature wall lights
- 9. Picture shelf
- 10. Flipchart/whiteboard



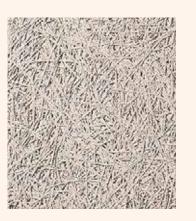






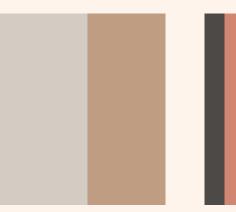

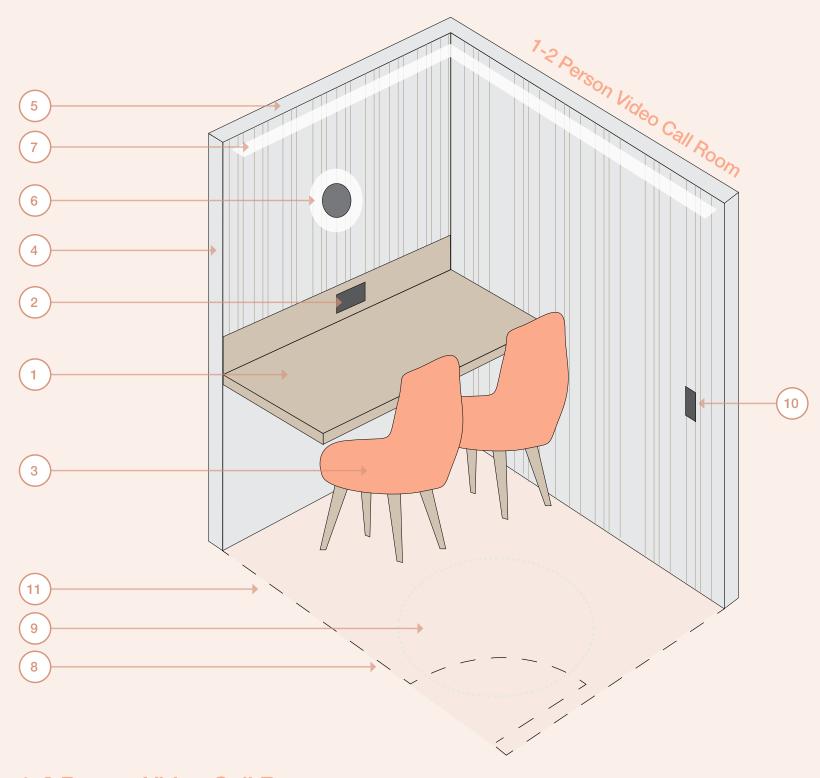
# Design Considerations



#### 4-6 Person Meeting Room

- 1. Position TV and camera to wall circa. 1200-1600mm from 7. FFL to centre depending on seating distance of TV and size 8. of room. Conceal all power and data requirements behind TV. Allow for pattressing localised to TV wall.
- 2. Power & data within table for laptop connection.
- 3. Semi-ergonomic chairs (with arms/casters depending on client preference). Ensure chair types fit comfortably alongside table base/legs and provide enough space to comfortably get in and out of.
- 4. Consider acoustics within wall build up, doors and seals.
- 5. Acoustic wall panels to minimum x2 adjacent walls opposite 13. Consider privacy manifestation to glazed partitions and
- 6. Additional acoustic softening within ceiling and carpet

- Adequate overhead lighting and avoid glare on TV.
- Consider booking system to external wall or tech panel.
- Consider whiteboards and/or pinboards, either fixed or moveable for larger format meetings.
- 10. Consider credenza or side unit for meeting room storage and surface for refreshments.
- 11. Consider accessibility. Ensure turning circle allowance at door and adequate circulation around table.
- 12. Consider ceiling mounted microphones and speakers positioned above table.
- curtains, blinds and/or black out blinds to any external windows.

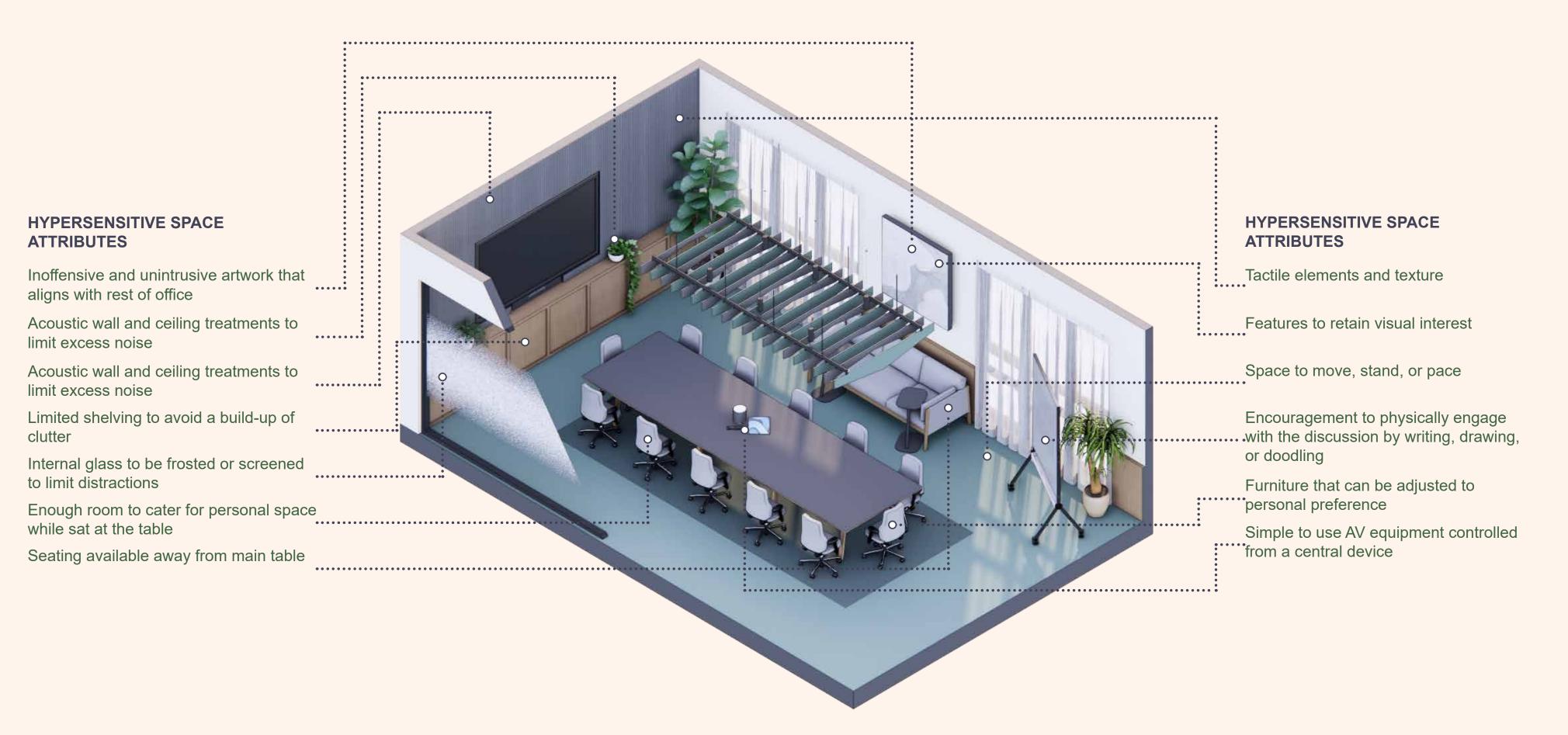
## Designing for Neurodiversity

#### **HYPERSENSITIVITY**

Hyper-sensitive is where the brain processes more sensory information. So, a person may feel certain senses strongly which can overwhelm the person and lead to stressful experiences

#### **HYPERSENSITIVITY**

Hypo-sensitivity is where the brain processes little sensory information. So, a person may feel certain senses faintly as they are receiving little sensory information to process



#### **OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

Natural calming colour scheme with limited colours and patterns with pops of colour and artwork for visual relief

Ability to moderate background noise with sound-masking / white noise

Prioritise natural light over heavy artificial light with window treatment option

Flooring with minimal distracting patterns and shapes, clearly defining specific areas in a calming colour. Include an acoustic underlay to avoid sound and vibration transfer

Seamless online booking system to allow for maximum transparency

Isolated lighting circuit with warmth and dim controls

Ensure there are enough screens for everyone to easily see, and enough microphones and speakers for everyone to comfortably hear/be heard

## Dressing Items

Post-covid, working from home during the working day became a much more accepted norm in the work environment. If employers want their employees to come into the office more frequently, they now need to entice them in.

A successful way to persuade employees back into the workplace can be by adapting the environment by blurring the lines between work and leisure, or to summarise more concisely, through 'Hotelification' of the office.

By drawing inspiration from hotels and embracing hospitality principles, employers can create environments that prioritise employee comfort, collaboration, and well-being.

The images on this page present a look and feel of what elements I would consider as essential to incorporate when 'hotelifying' a meeting room. To allow for a visual identity, I have presumed the concept I have been asked to incorporate is Mid-Century design features.

Providing acoustic finishes

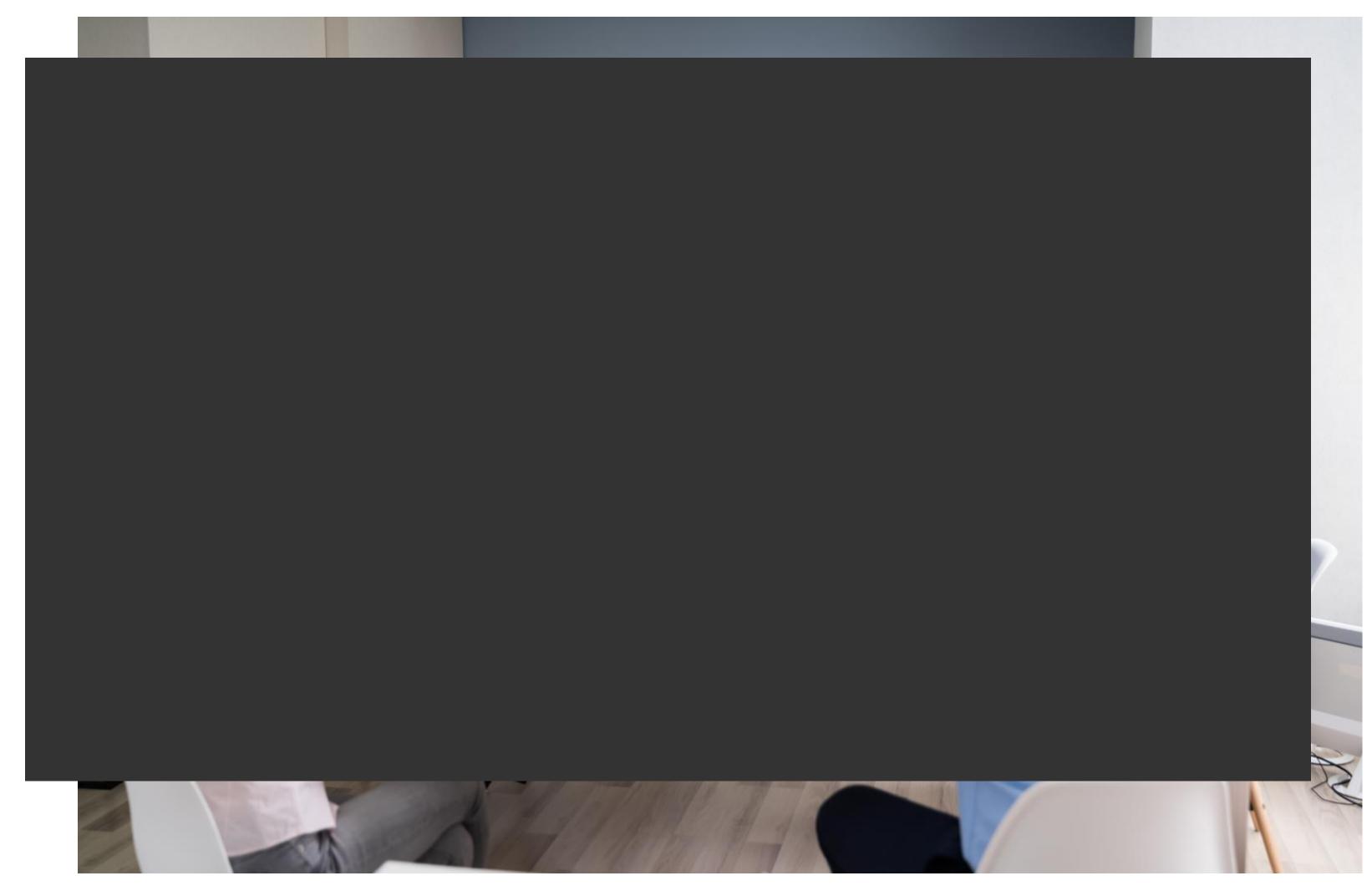
#### People in the room

Create comfortable environments – reduce meeting fatigue – improve productivity

Poor acoustic design makes it difficult to listen in remotely





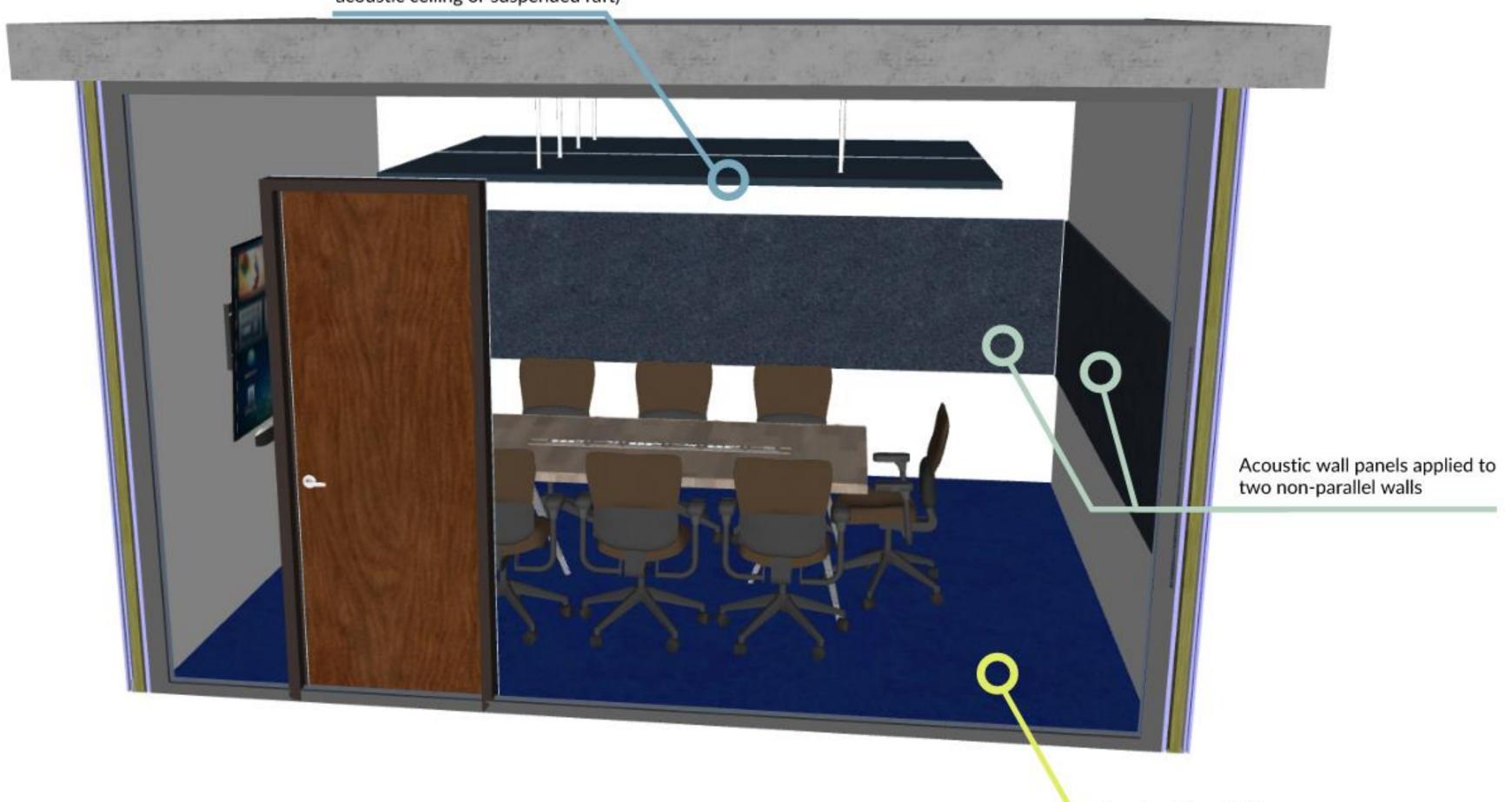
### Designing for good sound quality

Acoustic treatment to soffit (e.g. acoustic ceiling or suspended raft)

### Carpeted floors

Acoustic treatment to soffit (ceiling tile, raft, baffle)

Allow for acoustic wall panels in rooms where hybrid/video conference calls are likely

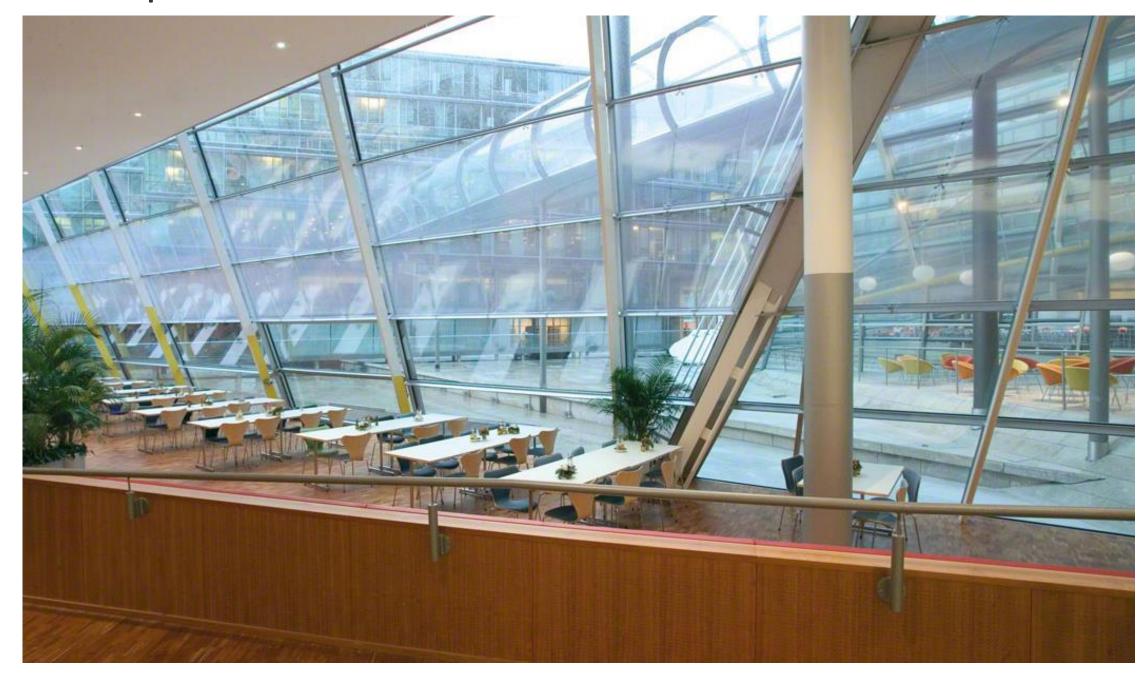

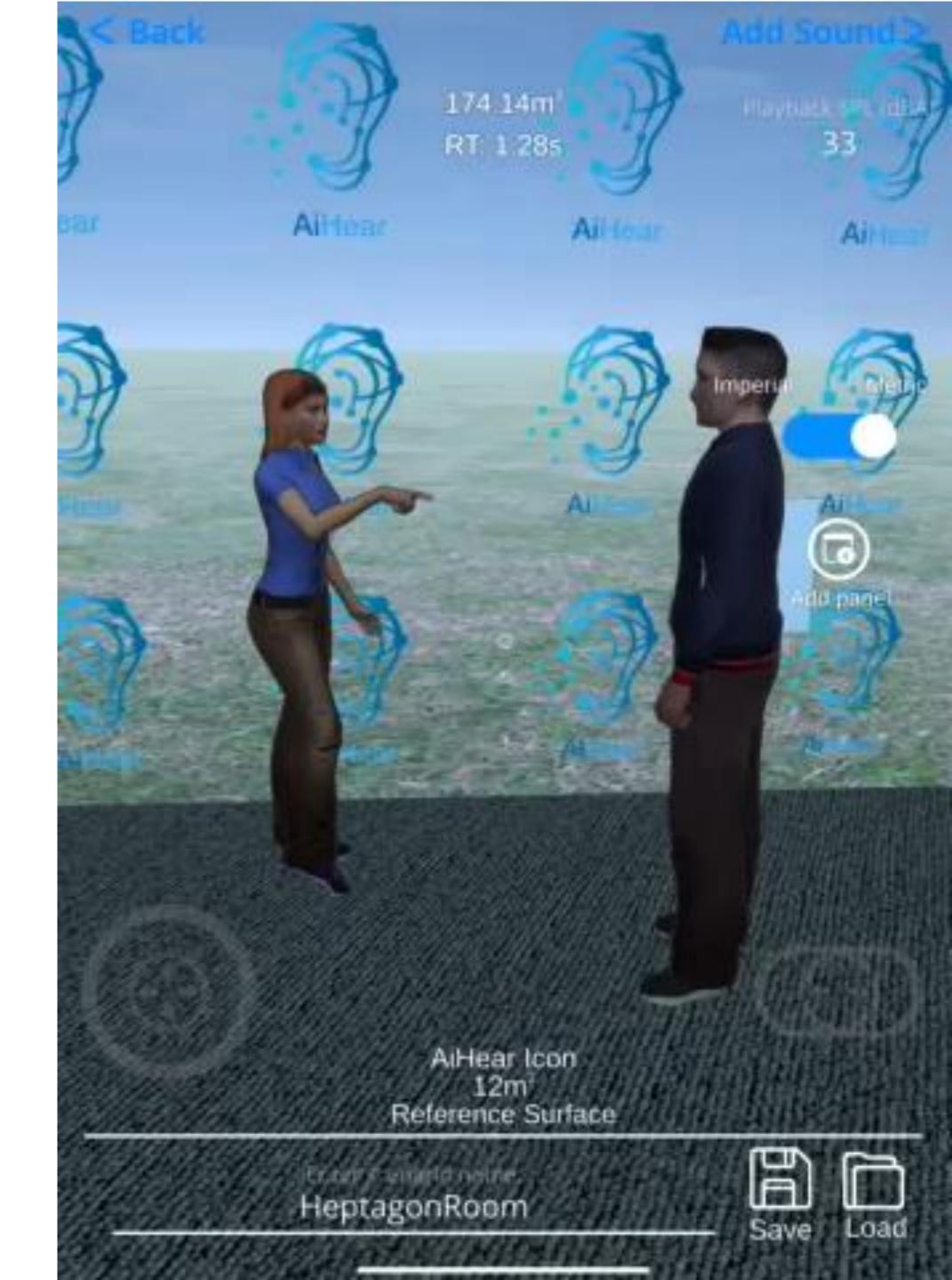

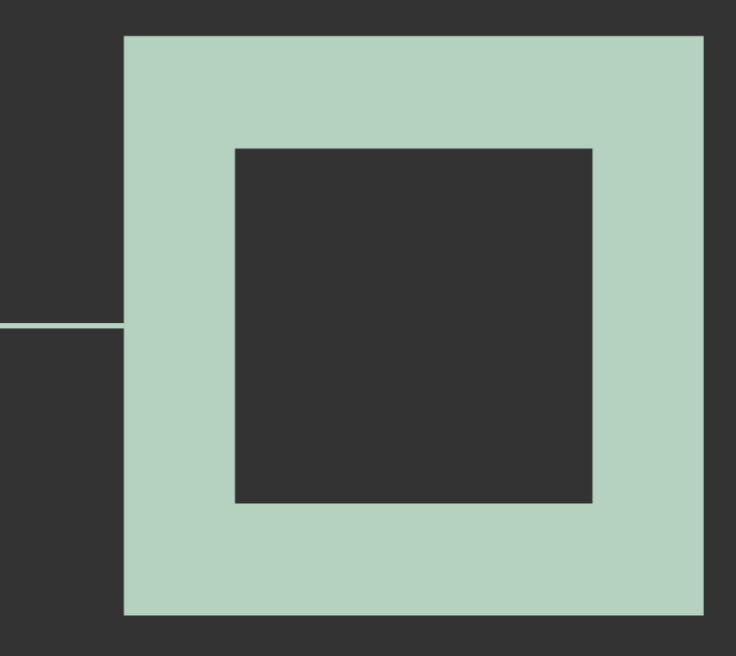

- Power and AV which doesn't clutter the meeting room tables



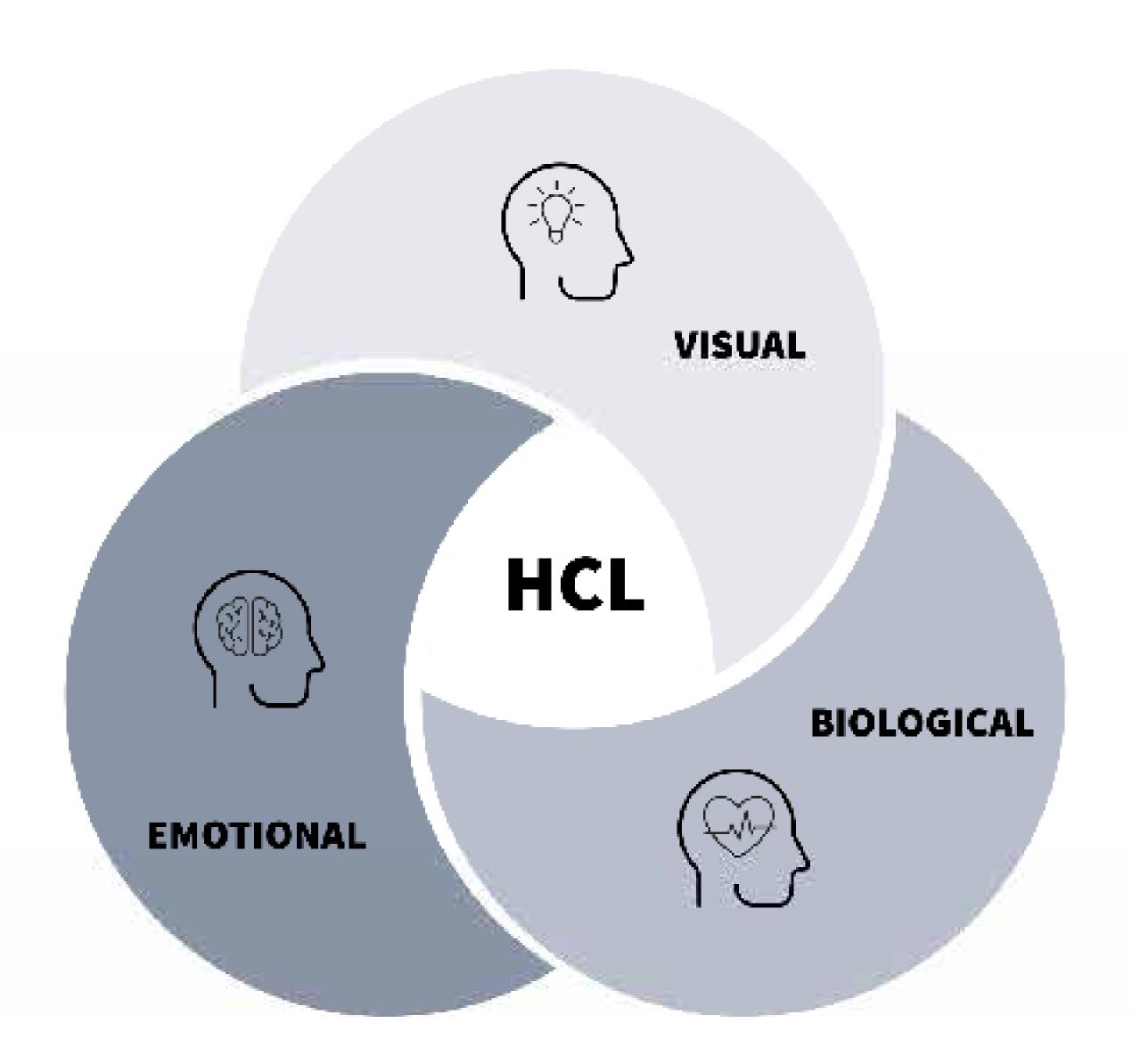

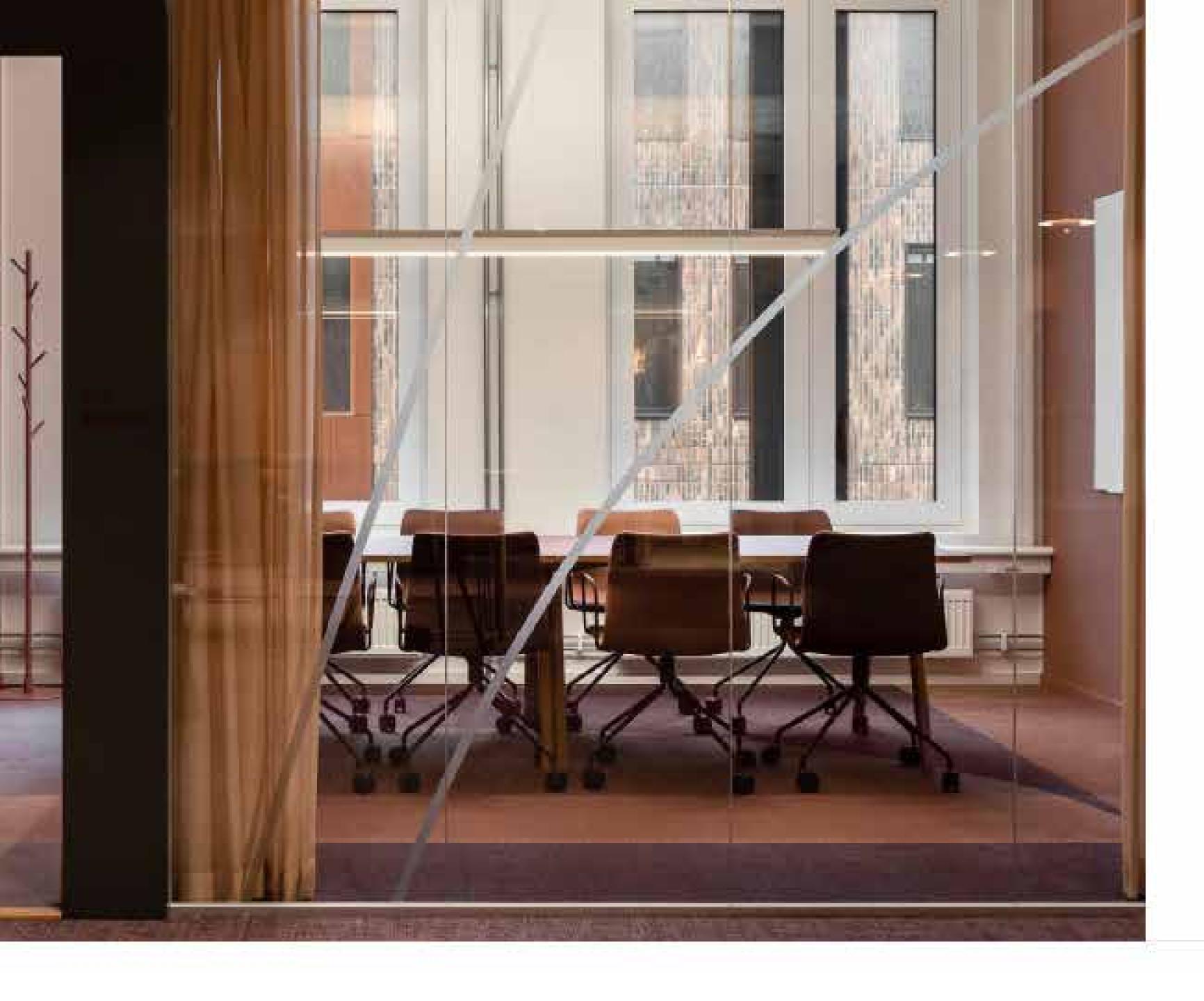

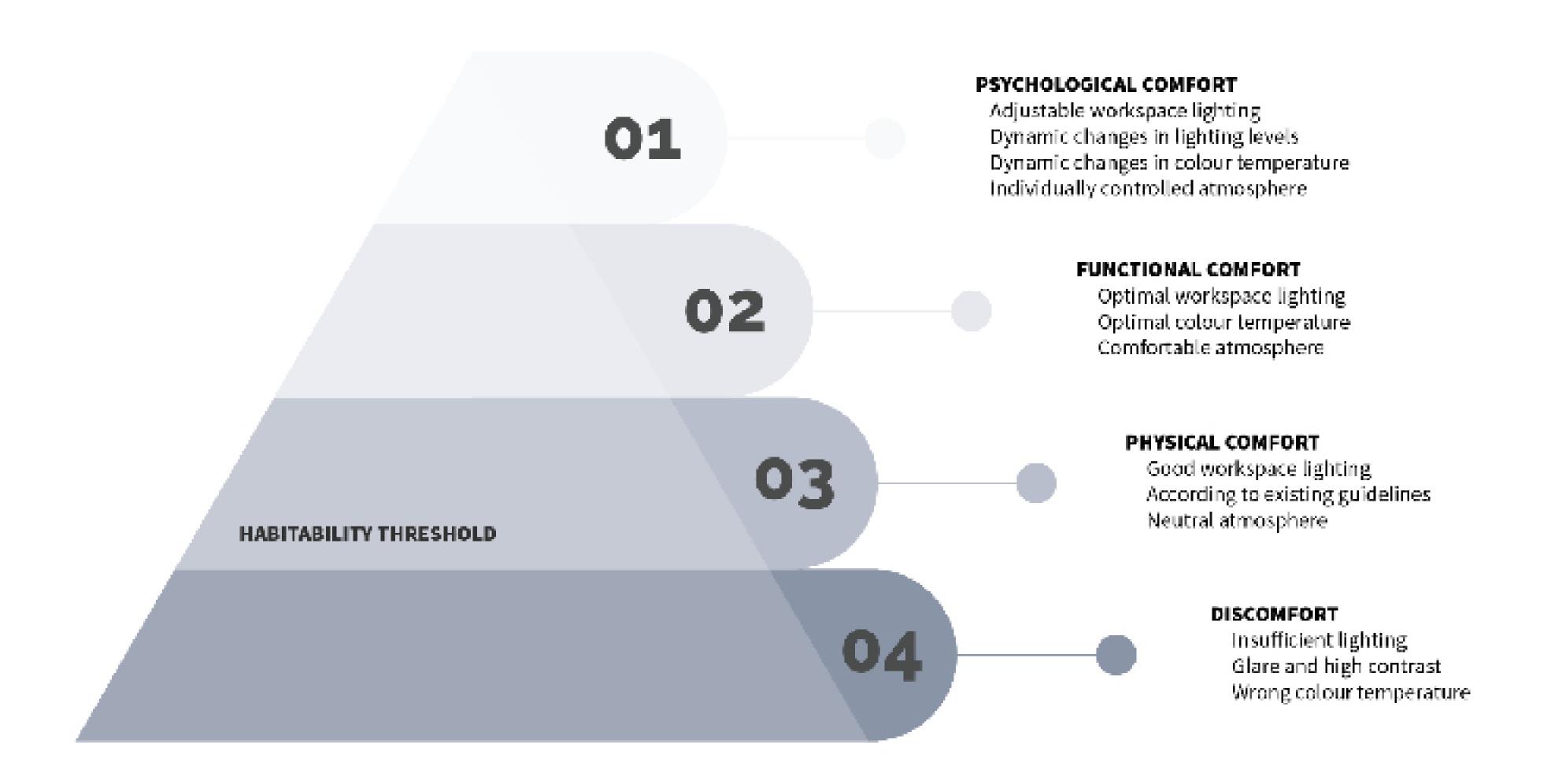
